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## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I really believe that if a community needs rain then Camp Hill should schedule an outdoor function.

With the predicted weather forecast for this week we have had to **CANCEL**:



- **Senior Field carnival – rescheduled to Monday 22 June**
- **Senior Track carnival – rescheduled to Tuesday 23 June**
- **Fun Day – rescheduled to Tuesday 21 July**

The safety of the students is our priority and wet conditions can make for potentially dangerous conditions on the tracks. If required we will announce any changes to the Junior Carnival, scheduled for Friday 19 June, on Thursday 18 June. Here's hoping that it will be able to go ahead as planned.

### 2016 PREP

As we move into planning for the 2016 school year I ask that any family who intends to enrol their son/daughter into Prep next year contact the office immediately. We will be sending Offers of Enrolment out in the next seven days and we are keen to track all enrolments. The school is Enrolment Managed and as such students who live in the catchment are offered immediate enrolment, followed by siblings of Camp Hill students and children of staff. Out of catchment places are offered after the above three groups.

### VOLUNTARY FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION (VFC)

Thank you to our families who have supported the school with the Voluntary Financial Contribution. This program (which is approved by our P&C) provides much valued financial support for the school ICT program (Prep to Year 6).

*The recommended contributions are \$60 a student or \$100 a family.* I believe that these recommendations are significantly lower than those of other state schools.

### OUT OF HOURS USE OF SCHOOL PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Camp Hill is very fortunate to have a range of outdoor play equipment. The equipment ranges from relatively easy recreational equipment to the Eric Waldrop playground which has inherent challenges that require supervision and direction from staff. To ensure the safety of all children on campus we ask parents **NOT** to let their children play on the equipment before or after school.

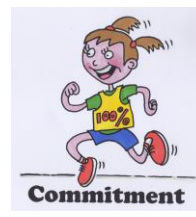
I must acknowledge the support of the teachers and parents at these events – they are certainly time-intensive, but well worth the effort.

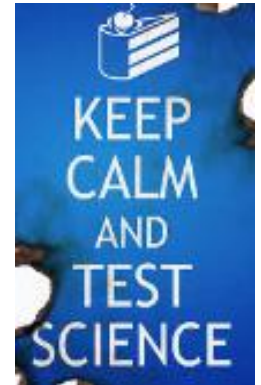
### STAQ MEETING FOR PARENTS

## LIBRARY NEWS

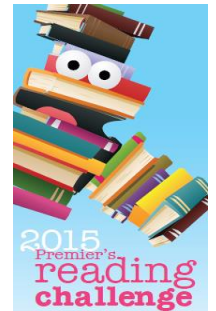
### BORROWING

It is great to see so many students borrowing library books each week. We would encourage all students to return any overdue books before the end of term and ensure they have something enjoyable to read over the winter break. We have lots of activity books, drawing & craft books, & cook books which are also a popular choice over the holidays.

### PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Four weeks into the challenge and some students have completed their challenge reading one book a day. There is still plenty of time, especially with holidays coming up, to make great progress towards reading, or experiencing, 20 books (Years 1-3) or 15 books (Years 4-6). ### NURSERY RHYME CHALLENGE

Over 70 Prep students completed their Nursery Rhyme Challenge, reciting eight Nursery Rhymes independently. Research demonstrates that nursery rhyme knowledge correlates highly with early phonological and print related skills. Well done Preppies, keep it up!

### YEAR 6 & 5/6D

These classes have been very engaged this term, learning skills to assist their research and information retrieval. Over the last ten weeks they have been introduced to a range of information skills that 21<sup>st</sup> century students need, including:

- Search skills - Boolean search operators, advanced search techniques to reduce the number of relevant hits.
- Evaluating and analysing websites – authenticity, authorship, currency, credibility. Just because it is on the internet doesn't mean it is true! What is the difference between .com, .org, .gov?
- Copyright & Creative Commons licensing – what is it? How to use CC to protect own work, how to search using CC terms to find images, video and sound files that can be legally used in presentations.
- Digital footprints – your digital journey & how to create a positive digital footprint. Think before you post!
- Referencing & bibliographies – how to attribute print and electronic sources used in assignments & presentations, to avoid plagiarism.



It has also been a great opportunity to introduce students to a range of literary texts and hear their opinions on books they have read each week.

Our **Year 6 Library Monitors** are proving to be very reliable and responsible helpers, turning up on a regular basis to assist with a variety of Library tasks. Great work Monitors!
